2016-2017 Library grading policy

Grades K-2

Students in grades K-2 will receive a grade of 4, 3, 2, or 1 on all graded assignments. In addition, weekly rubric grades will be entered into PowerSchool to measure participation and being responsible for library materials. To receive a 4, a student must demonstrate thoroughness, independence and consistency. Therefore it will take time for students to achieve a level of 4. Most students will typically earn a 3 or 2 regularly, which is totally normal. It takes time for students to develop their skills and become responsible. Students needing significant redirection and those demonstrating minimal effort may receive a 1.

Grades 3-8

Students in grades 3-8 will receive various point values depending upon the assignment. Some assignments will be out of 10 points while others may be of higher or lower point value. In addition, students will earn up to 10 points per class period measuring participation, effort and being prepared for class with any required materials (including being responsible for any checked out library materials). A weekly rubric is posted in the library and students will be measured according to the posted criteria. The weekly points will be entered into PowerSchool by date so you may monitor progress. If a student is not present for at least half of a class period. Any student who is asked to leave class due to inappropriate and/or disruptive behavior, and therefore unable to complete classwork for the day, will receive reduced points.

Mid-terms and final exams will be given to students in grades 6-8. Checklists will be given 2 weeks in advance and will outline everything the students need to study to prepare for the exams.

Students who miss class due to absences, appointments or band lessons will be responsible to make up any required assignments. No late assignments will be accepted without prior approval. Partial credit will be given for incomplete assignments. If there are extenuating circumstances such as a prolonged illness or hospitalization or family emergency, I must be contacted via email. Family vacations do not count as extenuating circumstances. Students may use study hall times in grades 6-8 or open lab times to complete outstanding library assignments.

Appropriate detention may also be assigned per All Saints Catholic Academy detention policy.

Grades will be weighted as follows:

50% of the grade will be projects/assignments 30% of the grade will be class participation and effort (potential 10 weekly points) 20% of the grade will be quizzes Should you have any questions or concerns, please email me at kdaless@ascaalbany.org.
